2023 Clinician Information

Anton Armstrong will be our **Adult Clinician**. The 2022-23 season marks Anton's 33rd year as Conductor of the St. Olaf Choir, marking him as the longest tenured conductor in the ensemble's storied 111 year history. He is the Tosdal Professor of Music at St. Olaf College, becoming the fourth conductor of the St. Olaf Choir in 1990 after ten years in Grand Rapids, Michigan, where he served on the faculty of Calvin University and led the Calvin Alumni Choir, the Grand Rapids Symphony Chorus, and the St. Cecilia Youth Chorale.

Marty Haugen will be our **Worship Clinician**. Marty is a liturgical composer and musician. He has written over 400 compositions for both Roman Catholic and Protestant congregations. After working as a full time parish musician for 15 years, for the past 35 years he has presented workshops and concerts across North America, Europe, the Pacific Rim, and Asia for church musicians.

Jill Mahr will be our **Handbell Clinician**. Jill earned a Master of Music degree in Flute Performance. In addition to flute instruction at St. Olaf, Jill directs the St. Olaf Handbell Choir, the St. Olaf Chapel Ringers, and oversees the direction of the student-led Manitou Handbell Choir. Jill also directs four youth handbell choirs at her church, Bethel Lutheran in Northfield, ranging in age from 3rd grade to 12th grade.

Heather Potter will be our Children's Choir Clinician. Heather is Director of Traditional Music for Covenant Presbyterian Church in Charlotte North Carolina, where she oversees traditional worship music planning, prepares youth singers and conducts two children's choirs. Heather is a Past-President of the Choristers Guild National Board and served on the development team and advisory board for the Choristers Guild Institute.

Kenney Potter will be our **Youth Choir Clinician**. For the past seven years, Kenney has served as Conductor and Artistic Director of the Charlotte Master Chorale. Kenney serves as Choral Conductor at Covenant Presbyterian Church in Charlotte, North Carolina. He has conducted numerous state-wide festival choirs. He received the Lara Hoggard Award for distinguished accomplishments in the field of choral music and is a published composer.

David Winkler will be our **Instrumental Clinician.** David has served as pianist, orchestra director, and minister of music in churches in Texas, Tennessee, and North Carolina. David is a composer, arranger, and orchestrator with several hundred published pieces. David is currently serving as the music associate at Great Hills Baptist Church in North Austin.

Deadlines and Other Information

- Registration: Conference registrations can be made by returning the brochure you should have received in February, you can make a copy off our website, or you can register on line. There is a convenience fee for each registration done on line. Deadline is June 15, 2023 for the early registration. After that date there is a late charge added.
- Room Reservations: Reservations for room and board at Green Lake need to be made by May 10, 2023, especially if you have special requests.
- Meal Tickets: If you are camping or staying off grounds and want to have a meal in the Dining Hall, you need to request those tickets at least 2 weeks in advance. They were limiting the number they would sell on site before the Pandemic. Now they want to know much earlier.
- FABM Scholarships: Registration scholarships for youth, children, and adults are available through FABM. To apply for a scholarship, please print the appropriate form from the website (www.fabm.com) and have the applicant fill it out. A recommendation by church staff needs to accompany the application. **Deadline is May 1, 2023**.
