The weeks of Advent and Christmas are the most musically evocative of the entire year. I relish the familiar carols and hymns, the sometimes haunting melodies, and the fresh musical ways to tell a time-worn but never worn-out story. We musicians are in our element.

Especially at this time of year we are angels. Yes, you read that right. The Greek word ἄγγελος (angelos) has a double meaning: "angel," but also "messenger," which makes sense from a theological perspective. Just sayin'...)
